

SUN Laichen was educated both in China and the US. He received his Ph. D. from University of Michigan and is currently Professor of Southeast Asian History at California State University, Fullerton. Sun was Senior Research Fellow at Asia Research Institute, National University of Singapore in 2003; Research Fellow at the Center for Southeast Asian Research, Kyoto University in 2008; Visiting Fellow at the Academy of Korean Studies, Seoul in 2017. He was Specially Appointed Professor in the Global History Program at Osaka University, Japan from 2016 to 2018, and is Specially Appointed Professor in Southeast Asia History at Shanghai Normal University since 2020. Ever since 2000, he has been teaching history courses on world/global history (both lower and upper divisions), Southeast Asian history, Vietnamese history, and gunpowder technology. His research interests include Southeast Asian-Chinese historical relations, early modern Asian military history and translation history, and global history in the early modern era (circa 1400-1800). His major publications include *Southeast Asia in the Fifteenth Century: The China Factor* (co-editor), “Chinese Historical Sources on Burma: A Bibliography of Primary and Secondary Work,” and many other articles. Sun is also the organizer and chief editor of the “Translation Series of Overseas Southeast Asian Studies (海外东南亚研究译丛)” (published by Commercial Press 商务印书馆 in Beijing) and the organizer of “Yao Nan Translation Prize (姚楠翻译奖)” in China. He now serves on the Board of the Asian Association of World History since 2019.
