

Shingo Minamizuka is Professor Emeritus of Chiba University and Hosei University. Being master of international relations, he studied Soviet, Hungarian and Bulgarian histories and in the 21st century he has been trying to construct the world history from the view point of international relations in the 19th and 20th century. He was one of the founders of AAWH and its first President (1908-1912). After 8 years of collaboration of Asian historians, he was successful in publishing with the collaborators a book on the comparative study of world history teaching in Asian countries. Since 2004 he is Director of Research Institute for World History in Shibuya, Tokyo.
