

Amal GHAZAL

Prof Amal Ghazal is Professor of History and Dean of the School of Social Sciences and Humanities at the Doha Institute for Graduate Studies. She received her BA from the American University of Beirut and her MA and PhD in History from the University of Alberta. She was a postdoctoral fellow at the University of Toronto, and a faculty member at Dalhousie University in Halifax, and Simon Fraser University in Vancouver, where she also directed the Centre for Comparative Muslim Studies, and held the title of Simon Fraser University Professorship in the Comparative Study of Muslim Societies and Cultures. She specializes in modern Arab intellectual history. She was the recipient of several grants from the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada, of the Gerda Henkel Foundation Research Scholarship, and the Institut d'Etudes Avancées de Nantes Fellowship. Her publications have covered many topics and have encompassed a wide geography, from the Arabian Peninsula to East Africa, from the Levant to North Africa.
