She has been Gillespie Visiting Professor at the College of Wooster, Ohio, US, a Fellow of the Indian Institute of Advanced Study, Fellow of the Rockefeller Foundation's Bellagio Center, and a Visiting Professor at the Maison des Sciences de l' homme, Paris.

Her significant books include *Independence and Partition: The Erosion of Colonial Power in India* (2000); *India's Struggle for Independence* (1988; with Bipan Chandra et al); *RSS, School Texts and the Murder of Mahatma Gandhi- The Hindu Communal Project* (2008; with Aditya and Mridula Mukherjee) and *Education and Social Change: MVF and Child Labour* (2008).

Her fields of interest span the short and long history of the twentieth century, its politics, political economy and social change.
