Dr Huimei ZHANG is a Senior Research Fellow at the Nanyang Centre for Public Administration and the Centre for Chinese Language and Culture, School of Humanities, Nanyang Technological University, Singapore (NTU Singapore). She obtained her Bachelor's degree in History and a Diploma in Computer Science from Sun Yat-sen (Zhongshan) University in China, and holds a Ph.D. in Chinese Studies from the National University of Singapore.

From 2021 to 2024, she served as Assistant Director (Research) at the Chinese Heritage Centre, NTU. She is currently the Executive Editor of *Huaren Yanjiu Guoji Xuebao* (*International Journal of Diasporic Chinese Studies*) and previously served as a Council Member and Editorial Director (2010–2013) of the South Seas Society (Singapore).

Dr Zhang's main research interests include history of Chinese diaspora, Southeast Asia—China interactions, and historical economic and business networks. She has published extensively in academic journals, edited volumes, and books. Her articles have appeared in core academic journals such as *Asian and Pacific Migration Journal, Journal of Chinese Social and Economic History*, and *Southeast Asian Affairs*. Her recent publications include *The Making of Singapore as an Asian Regional Corridor: Historicity, Trade, and Diaspora* (Routledge, 2025), *Boundaries and Bonds of the Chinese Diaspora: Empirical and Theoretical Studies* (Singapore: World Scientific Publishing 2025), *Chinese Emigrants Write Home, 1900s—1980s: A Bilingual Anthology of Family Letters* (Singapore: World Scientific Publishing 2020), and *Qiaopi Trade and Transnational Networks in the Chinese Diaspora* (Routledge, 2018).
